## **1. Preparing your holidays**

What do you want to do for the holidays?

To start, you need to choose what you are going to do during your holidays.

Before you go on holiday, there is a lot to prepare!

- First, you need to **book** a flight and a hotel.
- To do so, you will do some research on the internet and probably make some calls.
- Once your flight and your hotel are booked, you will need to pack your luggage.



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When we talk about the transport from your place to your destination, we say:

#### To travel + by + means of transport

#### Examples:

If you are not going too far away, you can travel **by** bus, **by** train, or **by** car. If you're going further, you can travel **by** plane or **by** boat.

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### 2. The trip to your destination

Here's a checklist for you to bear in mind when travelling by plane:

- Check the "restricted or prohibited items" list before packing.
- Check your baggage allowance before packing.
- Be there on time, you don't want to miss your plane!
- Don't forget to do the check-in before boarding the plane.
- Bring your hand baggage to security before boarding.
- Show your **boarding pass** before boarding the plane.
- Fasten your seatbelt before takeoff.
- Listen to the safety instructions before taking off.
- Enjoy your flight until your plane lands.
