6. Some useful expressions in connection with transport and travelling

a journey	A travel from one destination to another.
to commute	To travel to work or school on regular basis.
a traffic jam	A situation where there are so many cars, buses, and other means if transport that the traffic stops moving or moves slowly.
a railway station	A station where you can get on or off a train.
a single ticket	A ticket you get when you pay for a one- way journey to somewhere.
a return ticket	A ticket you get when you pay for a journey to one destination and back.
a season ticket	Usually a bus or a train ticket where you can go by bus or train every day for a month, or a year.
a passenger	A traveller riding in a vehicle but not operating it
a rush hour	It usually happens at the beginning and end of the working day when many people are traveling to or from work or school.
