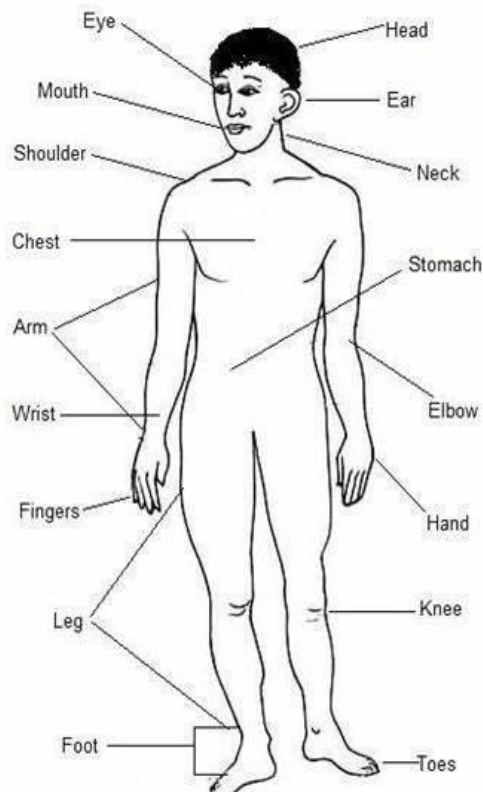

2. Health problems

Part of the body + **ache**

Sore + Part of the body

Bad + Part of the body

These three forms are usually used to talk about general health problems.

The common collocations are:

Noun + ache	Headache
	Backache
	Stomach ache
	Muscle ache
Bad + noun	Bad back
	Bad head
	Bad leg
Sore + noun	Sore throat
	Sore eyes
	Sore feet
I have + noun	I have a cold
	I have a sore throat
	I have a fever

3. Types of illness

allergy

- To have a bad reaction to animals, dust, foods or plants. The symptoms are red eyes, runny nose and sneezing.
- **Example:** He has allergy to cat hair.

cough

- It is a reflex mechanism to defend the respiratory tract that is very noisy.
- **Example:** I need a syrup – I have a bad cough.

diarrhea

- An abnormal frequency of fecal evacuations usually caused by an intestinal disorder.
- **Example:** He kept going to the toilet – he has diarrhea.

fever / temperature

- Abnormally high body temperature, to feel hot.
- **Example:** He had very high fever and they took him to the doctor's.

the Flu (influenza)

- A disease caused by a virus that can cause fever, headache, runny nose and sneezing.
- **Example:** The doctor said this flu is really dangerous.

hay fever

- An allergy to plants and flowers that cause symptoms of red eyes, a runny nose and sneezing.

- Example: He cannot go out during spring and autumn – he has a strong hay fever.

insomnia

- Not being able to sleep at night.
- Example. He hasn't slept for one week – he is suffering from insomnia.

stomachache

- A pain in the stomach or abdomen.
- Example: I don't feel like eating anything – I have a bad stomachache.

rash

- A skin condition with itchy and red spots.
- Example: He has a bad rash and he kept scratching himself.

sneeze

- An uncontrollable movement of air from the nose and mouth.
- Example: His nose was irritated so he kept sneezing.

sunburn

- Red and painful skin that comes from being in the sun too long.
- Example: He forgot to use the sunscreen at the beach and he got sunburnt.
