

EXPRESSING MOVEMENT

Main theme addressed	In this lesson, you will learn about the ruls yiou have to follow when expressing the movement.
Key Goals	Here is an outline of what you will learn today: 1. Prepositions of movement

- When expressing movement in English, we use different prepositions of movement. They express **movement from one place to another place**.
- The most common preposition of movement is the **preposition** 'to' it describes movement in the direction of something.

Examples:

I travelled to Spain last month.

Are you coming to my birthday party?

Did you go to the dentist yesterday?





1. Prepositions of movement

PREPOSITION	DEFINITION	EXAMPLE
ACROSS	movement from one side to the other side	It was impossible to get across the street.
AROUND	passing something in a curved route	There was a road construction, so we had to pass around that street to get to work.
AWAY FROM	distancing from where a movement begins	They slowly moved away from the bomb.
DOWN	movement from a higher point to a lower point	We went down the hill to get to his house.
FROM	indicating the point where a movement begins	We started our trip from Paris.
ΙΝΤΟ	movement to an enclosed space	He drove straight into pile of wood.
OFF	movement away from something	The glass fell off the table and broke.
ON TO / ONTO	movement to the top surface of something	He climbed onto the terrace of the building.
OUT OF	indicating the enclosed space where a movement begins	We went out of the office to get some fresh air.

OVER	movement above and	The birds flew over the
